ARTICLES

THERE ARE TWO KINDS OF ARTICLES

- The definite article:

the

- You use it before a **singular or a plural noun** when you talk about **something specific** (things, places or people) that is known to you:
- the tall man, the big house, the student next to me,

- The indefinite article:

a / an

- You use them before **a singular noun** when you talk about **something general**:
- a line, a house, a kitchen, a person, an apple, an airport, an idea, an umbrella.
- Use the article **a** before nouns/adjectives or numbers that start with a **consonant**:
- a student, a person, a book, a tall man, a job interview.
- You use the article **an** before nouns that start with a **vowel**:
- an apple, an idea, an umbrella, an hour, an interview.
