# THERE ARE TWO KINDS OF ARTICLES

• The definite article:

## the

- You use it before a singular or a plural noun when you talk about something specific (things, places or people) that is known to you:
- the tall man, the big house, the student next to me,

• The indefinite article:

### a / an

- You use them before a singular noun when you talk about something general:
- a line, a house, a kitchen, a person, an apple, an airport, an idea, an umbrella.
- Use the article a before nouns/adjectives or numbers that start with a consonant:
- a student, a person, a book, a tall man, a job interview.
- You use the article an before nouns that start with a vowel:
- an apple, an idea, an umbrella, an hour, an interview.
